Neighbors, this is what your BTHA Board is working on at the moment:

Change in Election Rules

If you have looked at the website recently, you will have seen that we have amended our Election Rules to allow Directors to be elected by acclamation (no counting of ballots) if the number of candidates does not exceed the number of vacancies on the Board. This was made possible by a recent change in State law and will save us time, effort and expense if, as is

often the case, the number of Board candidates is equal to or less than the number of vacancies.

Junipero Serra Median Project

Our big long-term project is to improve the median that separates Junipero Serra Boulevard from Balboa Terrace by removing all of the weeds, improving the soil, installing new irrigation and cultivating landscaping appropriate to the location. We have enlisted the support of our District 7 Supervisor Myrna Melgar, and we are hopeful that we can obtain some funding from the City. If you are interested in helping with this project, we would love to hear from you.

Upcoming Board Election and Election Inspectors

We are always on the lookout for new Board members. A healthy neighborhood HOA is one that is constantly infused with new and energetic Board members. If you are even remotely interested in serving on the Board, please reach out and we can tell you what we do. The current Board is collegial, respectful of each other and we work well as a group.

We also need one or more non-Board members to serve as Election Inspectors for the upcoming election. Cindy Hu has taken the laboring oar the past two elections, but she is unable to serve next year. Because of the new Election Rules described above, the job of being an Election Inspector is likely to be much easier for the next election cycle than in the past. Any volunteers?

Enhancing Your Yard and Garden During a Draught

Compost and Mulch: What's the Difference?

Compost is a soil amendment. It looks like soil, and it's hard to tell what it once was. That is because it is food scraps, landscape debris and manure from livestock, biosolids (human manure), and other organic matter that has already been partially consumed and decomposed mainly by microorganisms. Good compost worked into your soil brings oxygen, water, and healthy, sustainable growth to your plants.

Compost works in several ways. First, the compost itself contains particles improving soil structure. The resulting macro aggregates are composed of existing soil particles and decomposed organic matter, which combine to create a more stable and better functioning soil structure.

Mulch is a soil topping. Mulch may be organic or inorganic material covering the soil. It's made of larger particles and looks like recycled debris. Mulch can be made from organic matter such as grass clippings, leaf litter, shredded wood trimmings, or inorganic materials such as gravel or decomposed granite.

The microbes in healthy, biologically diverse mulch bind the organic matter together, forming a thick blanket. This cover protects soil and plant roots from temperature change, keeps moisture in by slowing evaporation from the soil's surface, and keeps weeds from sprouting by reducing sunlight penetration to the soil surface.

Mulch always stays on top of the soil. Unlike compost, it is never worked in. Recycled organic debris is the most effective type of mulch because it builds soil structure over time and provides a durable, protective surface barrier. The smaller the debris and the more mixed leaves with wood chips, the faster it decomposes. When building soil, small and diverse is best.

Farewell to a Neighbor

Former Board of Directors member Dave Slifer (84) passed away on May 30, 2022. Survived by his wife, Karna, who also served on the BTHA Board for many



years, Dave was known for his storytelling and booming laugh. Raised with a strong belief in community service, Dave served in many capacities on the Board beginning in the early '70s and continuing until he and Karna moved to Santa Rosa in 2014. Dave never

hesitated to roll up his sleeves and pitch in, whether it was setting up for our annual picnic or rounding up additional votes for the Board's annual election.
